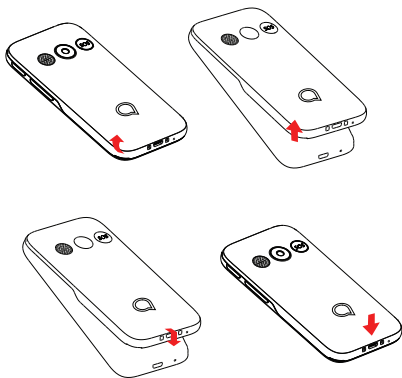

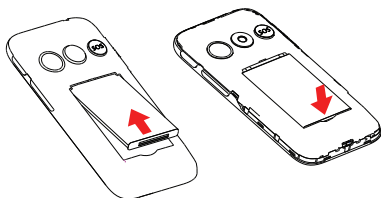
1.1 Set up

Removing or installing the back cover

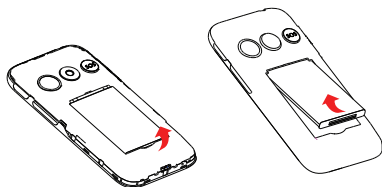


Installing or removing the battery

Insert and click the battery into place, then close the phone cover.

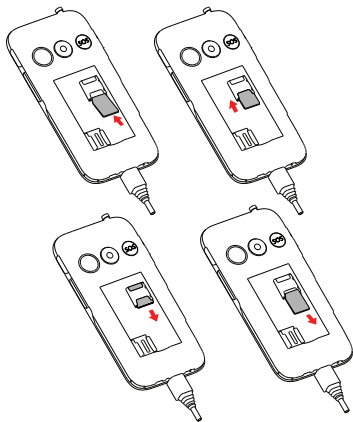


Unclip the cover, then remove the battery.



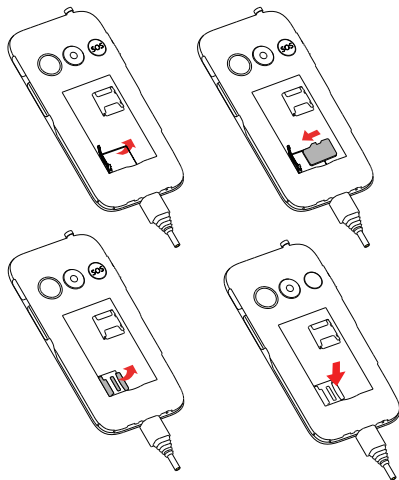
Inserting or removing the SIM card

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls.



Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press and slide it out.

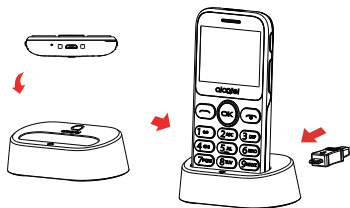

Charging the battery

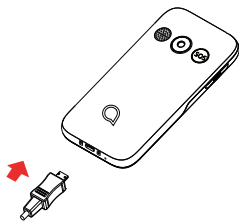
The phone can be charged in the following ways:

a.



To charge the phone, you can place the cradle charging connector of the phone to the cradle, then connect battery charger to the cradle and plug into the socket.

b.



Connect battery charger to your phone and plug into the socket

- Be careful not to force the plug into the socket.
- Make sure the battery is correctly inserted before connecting the charger.
- The mains socket must be near to the phone and easily accessible (avoid electric extension cables).



To reduce power consumption and wasting energy, when battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; reduce the backlight time, etc.

1.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the  key until the telephone powers on.

1.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the  key from the Home screen.

3 Making a call.....

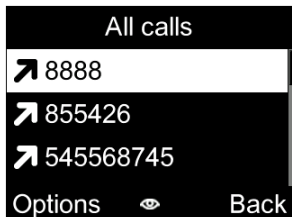
3.1 Placing a call

Dial the desired number then press  key to place the call. If you make a mistake, press  key to delete the incorrect digits.

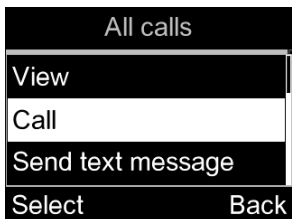


You can also make a call from your call log:

First, press  key from Idle screen to access the call log and choose the contact you want to dial, then select **Options**.

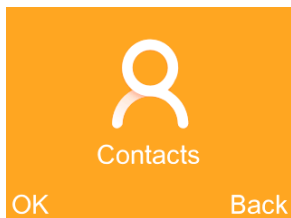


Then select **Call**.

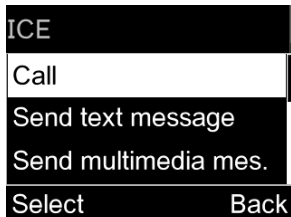
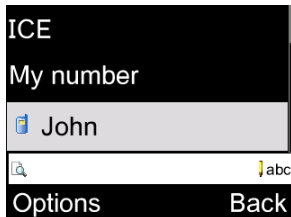


If you want to make a call from phonebook, select **Contacts\Options\Call**.

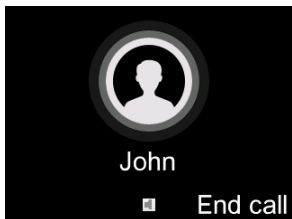
Select **Contacts** from main menu:

To hang up the call, press the  key (Select **End call**).

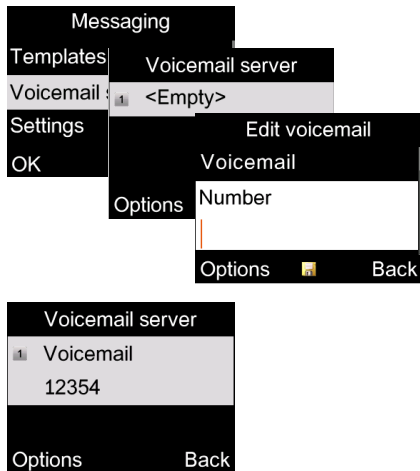


Making an emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial emergency number and press the send key to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code.



3.2 Calling your voicemail ⁽¹⁾

To access your voicemail, hold down the **1**  key. To edit your voicemail, select **Messaging\Voicemail server\Edit**, then you can edit the voicemail name and number. Finally, select **Save**.

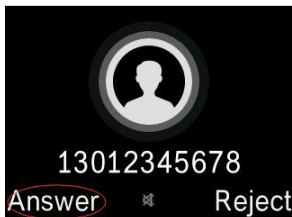

3.3 Receiving a call

When you receive an incoming call, press the  key to talk and then hang up using the  key.

Select **Answer** to pick up the call.



If the icon  is displayed, vibration is activated and no ringtone will play.

If the icon  is displayed, the phone neither rings nor vibrates.

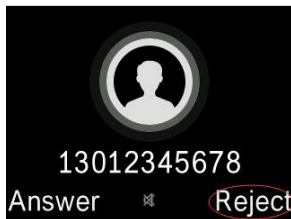


The caller's number is displayed if it is transmitted by the network (contact your network operator to check service availability).

Rejecting a call

Press the  key once.

Select **Reject** to reject the call.



3.4 During a call ⁽¹⁾

During a call, following options are available:

- Handfree (Press Menu key)
- HAC (Hearing Aid Compatibility)

You can adjust the sound level during a call by using the up/down or side key.



Move the handset away from your ear while using the "H-free" option because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

Handling two calls

- Answering a second call (ensure that "Call waiting" is activated, see page 55).

4 Assistance (SOS).....

4.1 SOS Contacts

To add an SOS number to your SOS contacts, select **Settings\Assistance (SOS) \Contacts list** and press **Options\Edit**, then you can edit your SOS numbers.


4.2 SOS Message

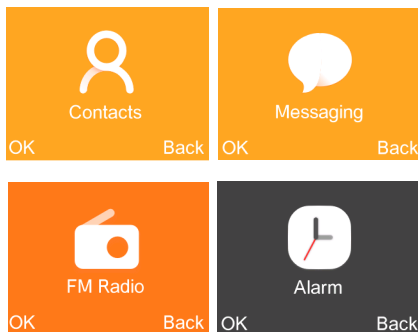
From the main menu select **Settings\Assistance (SOS)\Message** to create an SOS message.

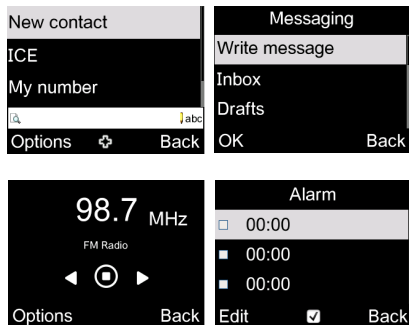

You can search for a contact by typing the initial of their name. Subsequent letters may be added to refine the search.

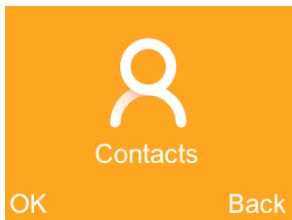

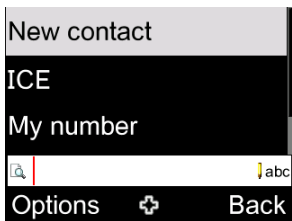
6.2 Adding a contact

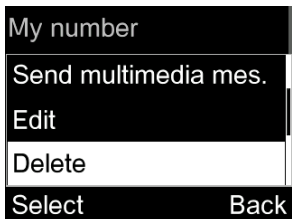


6.3 Delete a contact

Send the business card via SMS/MMS/Bluetooth.

Others

• Speed dial

To enable/disable speed dial and edit the speed dial number.

• Extra number

To enable/disable fixed dial and edit the fixed dial number.

• memory status

Review the memory status of your phone and SIM card.

• copy all

Copy all the contacts from phone to SIM or from SIM to phone.

• Move contacts

Move all the contacts from your phone to SIM or from your SIM to phone.

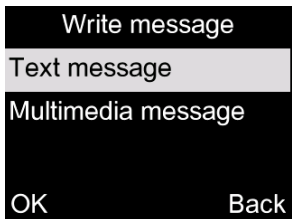
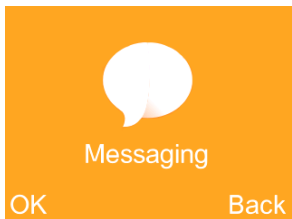
- **delete all**

Delete all the contacts from your SIM or Phone.

7 Messaging

7.1 Write messages

From the Message screen select **OK\Create message** to create a text/multimedia message.



How to type a message:

You can enter text using normal or predictive text input. To set your desired text input, press *** g'** to select.

For normal text input, press a number key, 2-9, repeatedly until the desired character is displayed. If the next letter you want is located on the same key as the present one, wait until the cursor is displayed.

For predictive text input, start entering a word by using the 2-9 keys and press the key once and the word will be modified each time you press a key. As you go on, the word will keep changing.

To insert a punctuation mark or special character, press **0+** key.

If you want to delete the already typed letters or symbols press **⌫** to delete them one by one.

7.2 Read message

From the Messaging screen select **OK\Inbox** to read the text/multimedia message.

How to read a message:

If a message comes, a notification will be shown in the idle screen. Press **Read** to read it or press **Exit** to keep it unread.

If you want to view all the messages received or sent, select **Messaging\Inbox\Outbox\Sent messages**.

While writing a message, select **Options** to access all the messaging options.

You can save any messages that you often send to Drafts.

7.3 Settings

Text message

Message centre

- SMSC address

You can view and edit your SMSC address.

- Validity period

You can set your message validity period as **1 hour, 6 hours, 12 hours, 1 day, 3 days, 1 week** or **Maximum**.

- Message type

To set your message type as **Text, Fax group 3, Fax group 4, Page** or **Email**.

- Status report

Select **on/off** to enable/disable status report.

- Reply path

Select **on/off** to enable/disable reply path.

- Voicemail server

To set your voicemail.

Memory status

You can view the memory status of your SIM card and phone.

Text msg. counter

You can view the quantity of your sent /Received messages.

Save sent message

Select On/Off to save sent messages or not.

Preferred storage

Set the path for the location of your saved messages.

Character set

You can set the character code as **Automatic** or **7 bit**.

Multimedia message

Data account

Select your data account for multimedia messages.

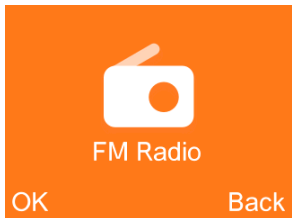
Common settings

In this menu, you can set **Compose, Sending, Retrieve, Preferred storage, Memory status**.

8 FM radio⁽¹⁾

Your phone is equipped with a radio ⁽²⁾ functionality. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels. You can listen to it while running other applications.

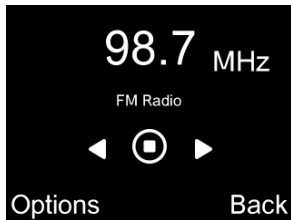
First, to turn on the radio, select **FM radio** from main menu.



⁽¹⁾ App availability depends on country and operator.

⁽²⁾ The quality of the radio depends on the coverage of the radio station in that particular area.

Then, search the channel by selecting **OK\Options\Auto search and save** (when using this function for the first time). Stations will be automatically saved to **Channel list**, and you can select one.



How to choose the existed channel:

a. From the FM radio main screen:

Scroll **left/right** key to change the channel.

b. From the channel list:

Select **Options\Channel list** after entering FM Radio, and choose the channel you like. You can **Play/ Edit /Delete** the selected channel.

How to add a new channel:

Select **Options \ Channel list \ <Empty> \ Edit** after entering **FM Radio**, and edit the **Channel name** and **Frequency**, then select **Save**.

Finally, to turn off the radio, press the Menu

key in the FM radio main screen.

Available options:

Channel list

Open the list of saved stations.

Manual input

manual input the channel you want to search for.

Auto search

Start auto search and stations will be automatically saved to "**Channel list**".

Settings

- Background play

Set to play the FM Play in the background.

- Audio quality

Adjust the audio quality to **Low** or **High**.

To set the record storage on Phone or on Memory card.

Record

Recording while playing FM.

File list

To view the recording files.

9 Camera.....

9.1 Camera

9.1.1 Take a photo, save or delete

The screen acts as the viewfinder. Position the object or landscape in the viewfinder and press  to take the image and the images will be automatically saved. If you don't want it, you may directly delete it.

9.1.2 Settings in framing mode

Before taking the photo, you can adjust a number of settings:

Photos

- View the images you have taken.

Camera settings

- Set **Anti-flicker**, **Scene mode**, **White balance**, **Delay timer**.

Image settings

- Set **Image size** and **Image quality**.

Storage

- Select **Phone** or **Memory card** to store the files.

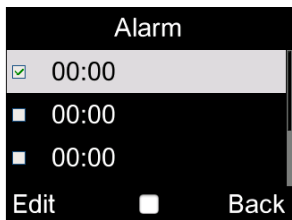
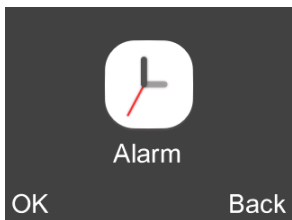
9.1.3 Options available after taking the photo

Once you have taken a photo, you can go to "Multimedia" to view it, send it by Bluetooth

or MMS, or set it as a wallpaper.

10 Alarm.....

Your mobile phone has a built-in alarm clock with a snooze feature. You can set up your alarm by selecting **Alarm\OK\Edit** from main menu.



- You can set up your time when you access above Alarm screen, select **Edit** to set the name, time, ringtone, snooze, repeat.

Time

You can set the alarm time.

Snooze

The alarm will repeat at regular intervals.

Repeat

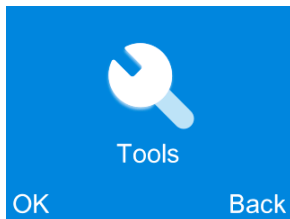
Select Once (default)/Daily/Working days as your preference.

Alarm tone

You can choose one tone as the alarm ringtone.

11 Tools.....

When you enter this menu, press **OK** to select your preferences in the following features: **Calculator, Calendar, World clock, Notes, My Files, Bluetooth, Call filter, Services.**





11.1 Calculator

Enter a number, select the type of operation and enter the second number, press **Equal** to display the result.

11.2 Calendar

Once you enter this menu, there is a monthly-view calendar for you to check date.

11.3 World clock

The first clock displays the time based on your location when you set up your phone. You can add other cities to show the time in their time zones.

11.4 Notes

You can add texts that need to be recorded.

11.5 My files

You will have access to all audio and visual files stored in phone or Memory card in My files.

11.6 Bluetooth

You can activate/deactivate the Bluetooth, check device list, edit phone's name, etc.

11.7 Call filter

You can create Blacklist and Whitelist through this function.

From **Call filter** phone screen, the following options are available:

Blacklist

You can add contacts to the blacklist mainly from the following ways:

1. Create a new one

From **Blacklist**, press **OK key** to create a new one.

- Enter a name and number.

- **Options > Save**

2. From Contacts

Blacklist > press **Call key** to select **From > Contacts**

- Select one contact from the **Contacts** list at a time.

- **Add to Blacklist? > Yes > Options > Save**

3. From Call Logs

Blacklist > press **Call key** to select **From** > **Call Logs**

- Select a contact or number from **All calls** in **Call logs**

- **Add to Blacklist?** > **Yes** > **Options** > **Save**

4. From **Messaging**

Blacklist > press **Call key** to select **From** > **Messaging**

- Select a message from **Inbox**

Whitelist

You can add contacts to the whitelist mainly from the following ways:

From **Whitelist**, press **OK key** to create a new one.

- Enter a name and number.

2. From **Contacts**

Whitelist numbers > press **Call key** to select **From** > **Contacts**

- Select one contact from the **Contacts** list at a time.

- **Add to Whitelist?** > **Yes** > **Options** > **Save**

3. From **Call Logs**

Whitelist > press **Call key** to select **From** > **Call Logs**

- Select a contact or number from **All calls** in **Call logs**

- **Add to Whitelist?** > **Yes** > **Options** > **Save**

4. From **Messaging**

Whitelist > press **Call key** to select **From** > **Messaging**

- Select a message from **Inbox**

- **Add to Whitelist?** > **Yes** > **Options** > **Save**

Settings

You are allowed to select from the following options:

1. Enable Blacklist

Enable the blacklist to automatically block all callers listed on the blacklist.

2. Enable Whitelist

Enabling the whitelist will only allow callers listed on the whitelist.

3. Disable Call filter

Disabling both blacklist and whitelist will allow any callers.

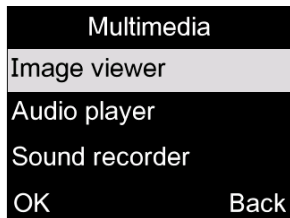
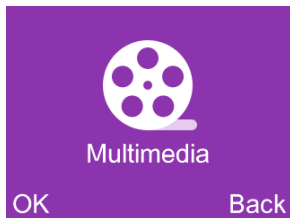
Note: Enabling both the blacklist and whitelist will only allow callers from the numbers listed on the whitelist. If there is no number in the whitelist, the phone will not allow any callers.

11.8 Services

STK service is the tool kit of SIM card. This phone supports the service function. The specific items depend on SIM card and network. Service menu will be automatically added to the phone menu when supported by network and SIM card. Note: Consult the local network operator for related fee and specific setup.

12 Multimedia.....

When you enter this menu, press **OK key** to select your preferences in the following features: **Image viewer, Audio player, Sound recorder.**



12.1 Image viewer

You can view images with this function.

12.2 Audio player

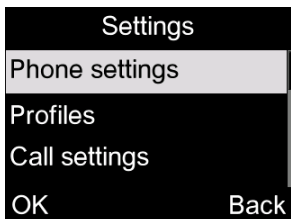
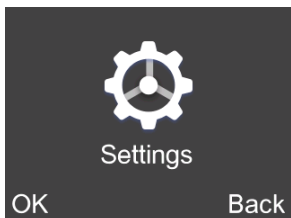
You can play the songs you prefer in the list.

12.3 Sound recorder

Use this function to record audio files. The phone support AMR and WAV. The recording file you stopped will be stored in audio file automatically.

13 Settings.....

From the main menu, select **Settings\OK** and access the function of your choice in order to customise your telephone.



13.1 Phone settings

To modify the phone settings, select **Phone settings** to reveal the following options: **Display, Time and date, Language, Pref. input method, Schedule power on/off.**

Display

This function allows you to set **Wallpaper**, adjust **LCD backlight**, **Keypad backlight**, and to turn on/off **Show date and time**.

Time and date

This allows you to modify date and time settings, including **Set home city**, **Set time/date**, **Set format**. You can also select On/Off to activate or deactivate **Update with time zone** and **Auto update time**.

Language

Choose the display language for messages here.

Pref. input method

Choose the input language in this menu.

Schedule power on/off

You can set the Schedule power on/off times using this function.

13.2 Profiles

With this menu, you can set the sound mode to **General, Silent, Meeting or Flight mode**.

13.3 Call settings

Caller ID

You can select **Set by network**, **Hide ID** or **Send ID**.

Call waiting

Activate/Deactivate the notification of a second incoming call by a beep. You can also query the status of waiting calls.

Call divert

You can activate, deactivate or query the status of call forwarding to voicemail or to a specified number. The following configurations are possible:

Divert all voice calls, **Divert if unreachable**, **Divert if no answer**, **Divert if busy**, **Divert all data calls**, **Cancel all divers.**

Call barring

The following configurations are possible:

Outgoing calls

All outgoing calls are barred.

Incoming calls

All incoming calls are barred.

Cancel all

Deactivate all call barring.

Change barring password

Change the original barring password for activating call barring.

Advanced settings

You can set **Auto redial**, **Call time reminder**, **Connect notice** and **Answer mode**.

13.4 Connectivity

You can access this feature to set and select your preferred data accounts.

13.5 Security settings

SIM Security

- **PIN lock**

You can protect your SIM security by inputting a PIN. The default setting is 1234.

- **Change PIN**

PIN lock must be enabled.

- **Change PIN2**

A protection code for certain SIM card features (FDN) will be requested if you attempt to access the card when the code is activated. Select to update it with a new one (between 4 and 8 digits).

Phone Security

- **Phone lock**

You can protect your phone security by inputting a phone password. The default setting is 0000.

- **Change password**

Change the phone's password.

13.6 Network settings

Network selection

Network connection can be switched between **Automatic** and **Manual**.

GPRS connection

GPRS connection can be switched between **When needed** and **Always**.

13.7 Assistance (SOS)

Refer to "Assistance (SOS)", page 23.

13.8 Regulatory & Safety

View your phone information, such as **Product model**, **Manufacturer name**, **IMEI**, **CU Reference**, etc.

13.9 Restore settings

Make the phone's settings recover to its default value. End-user data will not be erased. Enter its default password 0000 to confirm to restore and reboot.

13.10 About

Refer to the Privacy and User terms in this menu

14 Input mode.....

This mode allows you to type a text by choosing a letter or a sequence of characters associated with a key. Press the key several times until the desired letter is highlighted. When you release the key the highlight character is inserted into the text.

Safety and use

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your phone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

● **TRAFFIC SAFETY:**

Given that studies show that using a mobile phone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile when the vehicle is not parked.

When driving, do not use your phone and headphone to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your phone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure

that there is no problem:

- do not place your phone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area,
- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the dashboard is adequately shielded from mobile phone RF energy.

● **CONDITIONS OF USE:**

You are advised to switch off the telephone from time to time to optimise its performance. Switch the phone off before boarding an aircraft.

Switch the phone off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, mobile telephones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency.

using the "hands-free" mode because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage. Do not let children use the phone and/or play with the telephone and accessories without supervision.

When replacing the cover please note that your phone may contain substances that could create an allergic reaction.

Always handle your phone with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.

Do not allow your phone to be exposed to adverse weather or environmental conditions (moisture, humidity, rain, infiltration of liquids, dust, sea air, etc). The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is 0°C (32°F) to +40°C (104°F).

At over 40°C (104°F) the legibility of the phone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.
